Larrell L. Wilkinson is an Associate Professor of Community Health & Human Services at the Univ. of Alabama at Birmingham (UAB) in Birmingham, AL. His educational preparation includes both a PhD in Health Services, Policy, and Management and MSPH in Health Promotion, Education & Behavior from the U. of South Carolina (USC); a BS degree in Biology from Tenn State University (TSU); and Certified Health Education Specialist (CHES) certification.

Dr. Wilkinson has 25 years of employment in the areas of Public /Community Health & Human Services. In addition to his current position at UAB, his previous positions include a Postdoctoral Fellowship at the Institute for Partnerships to Eliminate Health Disparities at USC, Instructor and Lead Faculty Area Chair of Health Sciences at the U. of Phoenix, Columbia Campus, and Program Director of the USC Office of Substance Abuse, Prevention and Education.

At the state level, Larrell is a member of the Alabama State Assoc. of Health, Physical Education, Recreation, and Dance and has served as Secretary/Treasurer for the Board of Directors of the South Carolina Campaign to Prevent Teen Pregnancy. Regionally, he is the Chair of the Scholar Committee of the Deep South Resource Center for Minority Aging Research (RCMAR). Nationally he serves as the Chair of the Healthy Aging Community of Practice in the Society for Public Health Education (SOPHE).
